Braemar Gallery was opened in 1988 and is located in the historic Braemar House, Springwood. It functions as a community gallery, hosting changing exhibitions across three rooms that showcase works of local and regional artists. The gallery is a valuable community venue and over time has become well known for high standard exhibitions. Braemar Gallery is open to the public from Thursday to Sunday, 10am to 4pm.

Volunteer Role and Responsibilities

Braemar House & Gallery volunteers provide invaluable support by undertaking of a range of light duties and interesting tasks. Volunteers are allocated one or more three hour shifts per month as per their indicated preferences.

Key Responsibilities:

- 1. Open/close Braemar Gallery entrance and de-activate/activate the alarm
- 2. Switch lights on/off and open/close the three internal gallery room doors
- 3. Erect/remove external signage
- 4. Switch on/off electrical gallery equipment as directed
- 5. Welcome visitors and provide general information on Braemar House & Gallery
- 6. Keep up to date with exhibitions, read through the InSight Magazine and Braemar Gallery Information for Volunteers Folder (containing general information and special exhibition information, eg. turning on/off video screen)
- 7. Roam the gallery and monitor exhibition spaces
- 8. Report repair and maintenance issues
- 9. Restock and tidy flyers and InSight Magazines on shelves near entrance
- 10. Record gallery attendance figures.
- 11. Assist with gallery events such as exhibition launches and planned visits by schools and community groups

Experience

No experience is necessary, just an appreciation of art and an eagerness to greet visitors with a friendly smile and provide general information as required. Volunteer duties include carrying light weight external signage such as flags and A-frame signs. An induction briefing is provided to all new volunteers.
